

Implementation of a co-designed Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander QLD cohort across Queensland

Project Description

Project duration:	PhD or MPhil
Description:	<p>Researchers from the Indigenous Health group at Mater Research Institute- University of Queensland have recently received funding from NHMRC to co-design and implement a longitudinal cohort for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families.</p> <p>Following the co-design of this cohort with its Indigenous Steering group, this cohort will be implemented in 5 sites around Queensland. It will have a focus on the perinatal and early childhood period for mothers, their partners and children. Further it will have a series of nested interventions embedded.</p>
Expected outcomes and deliverables:	Opportunities exist for a PhD student to work alongside this research team to determine the feasibility and acceptability of the protocol implementation at each site.
